Tribal 8(a) Sole Source Process

Step 1
An Agency decides to sole source to PCI Aviation.

Step 2
Contracts sends an offer letter, with description of Project, to PCI Aviation's SBA Business Opportunity Specialist.

Step 3
SBA reviews Project and determines that PCI Aviation can perform the work as described.

Step 4
SBA sends a Letter of Acceptance to contracts.

Step 5
Contracts authorizes PCI Aviation and the requiring Agency to enter into negotiations and/or joint development of Project plan.

Step 6
Contract is awarded (once mutually agreeable terms are negotiated).

Notes:

Tribal 8(a) Sole Source awards take significantly less time to award than competed contracts and cannot be protested per 13 C.F.R. 124.517(a).

The President signed into law the 2020 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) allowing Tribal Sole Source awards up to \$100 million with local approval.
